Terminology

Language changes over time, and words mean different things to different people. New terms and ways of interpreting words and their meanings emerge frequently. This is the beauty of language, identity, and labeling oneself - it changes as we change.

The terms listed in this presentation are to give you an approximate meaning of what you may hear in the LGBTQ+ community. Every person gets to determine what terminology/descriptors fit them. When encountering a new term, it is best to ask the person what that word means to them and how that information should inform your interactions with them. Your genuine interest in learning about and understanding someone else's lived experience is what it is all about.

A person's identity refers to their sense of who they are.

Identities are complex and include many different parts. A person's identity may include gender, race, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religion, political affiliation, interests, hobbies, and more.



Everyone has an identity.

It is important for a person to feel proud of the many different components of their identity.

We are all different and we are all special!





Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity are two types of identity that every person has.

<u>Sexual Orientation</u>: describes the gender(s) a person is emotionally, romantically, or sexually attracted to


Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity are two types of identity that every person has.

Gender Identity: refers to a person's self identification as male, female, both, something in between, or neither. It is the inner experience of gender and who a person feels themselves to be.


This may or may not match their sex assigned at birth (which is typically based on reproductive anatomy)

Gender Expression

This describes how individuals communicate their gender to others.

People express and interpret gender through hairstyles, clothing, physical expression and mannerisms, physical changes to their body, or by choosing a name that reflects their own idea of gender identity.






Pronouns

Pronouns are ways we refer to people when we don't use their names - she/her, he/him, they/them, and more.

People use the pronouns that work best for them based on their gender identity and what they would like people to call them.

Getting someone's pronouns right is respectful and shows the person you care. If you get someone's pronouns wrong, offer a really short apology and then use the correct one!

People can choose their sexual orientation.

FALSE

Sexual orientation has to do with who we're attracted to, physically and romantically. We don't choose our feelings just like we don't choose who we find attractive. What we CAN choose is whether to act on those feelings, as well as what we call ourselves based on those feelings (our identity).

People can choose their gender identity.

FALSE

Just like sexual orientation, a person doesn't choose to feel male, female or a combination of both. What we CAN choose is what we call ourselves, even if it doesn't match our sex assigned at birth.

People can choose their gender expression.

TRUE

A person can choose to let people know their gender in whatever way feels comfortable or right to them. There are lots of ways to express ourselves, and that includes how we express our gender.

You can usually tell a person's sexual orientation just by looking at them.

FALSE

- Some people may stereotype another person
- based on their gender expression based on what
 - they see, they will think they know that person's
- sexual orientation. Sexual orientation has to do
- with who a person is attracted to; gender
- expression is separate from that.

Remember

Everyone has a sexual orientation and gender identity — it is part of who they are.
